It will also help you understand the importance of capturing and understanding the demographics, needs, and preferences of the residents, what a strategy must include, and what support can be offered to AP/PAPs.







TC124: Structural Risk Assessments and Management

Structural Risk Assessments (SRAs) are essential for identifying and mitigating hazards that may compromise a building's structural integrity, ensuring safety, and preventing costly repairs.

This course covers why buildings fail, the importance of thorough SRAs, defect identification, relevant guidance, and more.



TC126: The New Building Safety Regime (Part 4) – Higher Risk Buildings

Cassandra Zanelli, FTPI – PMLS & Mark Snelling – TPI H&S Advisor 11th and 12th September, 9:30am to 12:30pm – Online

This course covers the requirements of the new building safety regime for higher-risk buildings. It addresses duties related to managing building safety risks, such as fire spread and structural failure.

The course also explores the latest compliance approaches and the Building Safety Act (BSA) provisions on cost recovery for safety measures by the AP/PAP, among other topics.



TC127: Effective Management of Competence

Mark Snelling - TPI H&S Advisor 13th October, 1pm to 4pm - Online

The Building Safety Act and Building Regulations require organisations managing safety risks (fire spread and structural failure) in higher-risk buildings, or undertaking building work under the Building Regulations 2010, to have appropriate organisational capability.

This course explains the recently published Building Safety Regulations guidance, what competence looks like, and how it must now be managed.



TC128: Management of Building Works

Mark Snelling – TPI H&S Advisor / Neil Maloney (Fellow of the RICS/FTPI) 30th September and 1st October, 9:30 am to 12:30pm – Online

Changes to the Building Regulations have introduced new client duties with significant criminal penalties. While not yet tested in court, a managing agent may be considered a client and will need to ensure any building work complies with legal requirements. Whether managing the work directly or instructing specialists, managing agents must understand their clients' compliance obligations.

This course covers what constitutes building work, the required procedures, necessary approvals, and focuses on client duties.



TC129 - A Guide to Effective Procurement

Recent changes to the Building Regulations impose new client duties backed by criminal penalties, underscoring the risks for managing agents involved in procuring building works for their clients.

This course examines what procurement entails, why it matters, the consequences of non-compliance, standards of best practice, and the skills necessary for successful procurement.

TC39: Reading Leases

Understanding when permission is required and the basis for granting or refusing consent is an important part of residential leasehold management. An estate rent charge is an annual payment to a third party, often a management company, for maintaining parts of a new estate. As many managing agents now oversee developments with rent charges, this webinar helps clarify their rights and responsibilities. It covers rent charges, enforcement in cases of non-payment (including the Upper Tribunal decision in Roberts v Lawton), and common requests for deeds of variation.

W25: Are You Being Served

Managing agents send various notices to leaseholders, including service charge demands, Section 20 consultation notices, and notices of general meetings (including AGMs). Are these notices served correctly? What do leases and statutory requirements say about proper service? This webinar explores common leaseholder (and member) notices, typical service requirements, and where to find them to ensure correct service.



W27: Data Protection and GDPR in Leasehold Management

This two-hour webinar offers a general overview of the current data protection regime, and explores the key areas affecting managing agents, including subject access requests and handling data breaches.


